- 1. Which physical feature connects the Atlantic Ocean to one of the Great Lakes? <u>The St. Lawrence</u> <u>River</u>
- 2. What mountain range runs from north to south through Canada and continues down into the United States? <u>The Rocky Mountains</u>
- 3. Which ocean is found off of Canada's western coast? The Pacific Ocean
- 4. Which physical feature is wrapped around the Hudson Bay and provides mineral resources for Canada? <u>The Canadian Shield</u>
- 5. In which province located on the eastern side of Canada did French settlers first arrive? **Quebec**
- 6. Canada is the largest country in the western hemisphere, but has a population 3 times smaller than Mexico and 9 times smaller than the U.S. What main factor contributes to this? Canada's climate is harsh and difficult to live in the further north you go.
- 7. 90% of Canadians live within 100 miles of the border shared with the U.S. What factors cause so many people to live so close to that border? (Hint: there are 3) <u>The climate is subarctic and harsh</u> <u>throughout most of Canada, except for the south, there is more trade to be found with the U.S., and there is available farmland near the border as well.</u>
- 8. Name some of the natural resources found in the Canadian Shield. <u>Iron ore, nickel, zinc, copper, gold,</u> <u>lead, diamonds, and silver.</u>
- 9. Define the term "permafrost". When the soil in an area stays permanently frozen.
- 10. Define the term "drought". <u>A prolonged period of dryness.</u>
- 11. Define the term "tundra". It is a treeless plain in an Arctic region where little vegetation grows.
- 12. What are the environmental issues in Canada? (Hint: there are 4) <u>They are acid rain, pollution of the</u> <u>Great Lakes, mining in the Canadian Shield, and clear-cutting in Canada's forests.</u>

13. What are some solutions to the following environmental issues:
Acid Rain: <u>Canada has passed laws to limit pollution (answers may vary after that)</u>
Pollution of the Great Lakes: <u>The Great Lakes Water Quality Agreement was signed in 1971 to</u>
<u>restore the lakes and prevent future damage</u>

Mining in the Canadian Shield: <u>The government has made new laws about mining, reducing the</u> <u>amount of pollution allowed into the waterways</u>

Clear-cutting Canada's Forests: <u>Hundreds of millions of seeds are planted each year, billions of</u> <u>dollars are spent managing and protecting the forests, and money spent each year to protect</u> <u>wildlife and their habitat</u>

- 14. What are Canada's two official languages? French and English
- 15. When did French settlers first arrive in Canada and what did they call their first permanent settlement? <u>They arrived in the 1600s and called their first establishment Quebec.</u>
- 16. Define the term "sovereign". <u>Has control over its own affairs and is not controlled by another</u> <u>country.</u>
- 17. What were the three main reasons that people from Quebec wanted their independence from the rest of Canada? <u>1. French Canadians were afraid that their culture and language would disappear. 2.</u> <u>They were tired of feeling like second class citizens in their own country. 3. They wanted to be their own country, separate from Canada.</u>
- 18. What was the result of the vote for Quebec's independence? <u>It was extremely close, but the vote</u> ended in favor of Quebec remaining a part of Canada.

- 19. What are some ways that the French in Quebec are achieving equality? <u>The Canadian government has</u> <u>passed laws to preserve French language and culture, the Constitution Act made Canada</u> <u>bilingual, and French is the official language.</u>
- 20. What type of government does Canada have and who is its leader? <u>Parliamentary democracy and</u> <u>their leader is the prime minister.</u>
- 21. In Canada, a citizen must be how old to vote? They must be 18 years old.
- 22. Who do citizens vote for in Canada's government? Citizens vote for members of Parliament.
- 23. What type of economic system does Canada have and who answers the three economic questions in the country? <u>Canada has a mixed economic system and individuals and corporations answer the three economic questions.</u>
- 24. What are the key functions of NAFTA (North American Free Trade Agreement)? <u>Eliminating tariffs,</u> removing restrictions on investments, removing customs barriers at border crossings, establishing tough standards for environmental, health, and safety regulations, and improving working <u>conditions.</u>
- 25. What is a positive and a negative effect of NAFTA? (Any of the following answers are valid) **Positives:**
 - <u>Free trade increases sales and profits for Mexico, Canada and the U.S., thus strengthening their economies.</u>
 - Lack of tariffs has allowed Mexico to sell its goods in the USA and Canada at lower prices.
 - <u>This makes Mexican products more competitive in these markets and increases Mexico's</u> profits as it tries to develop its economy.
 - <u>Free trade is an opportunity for the U.S. to provide financial help to Mexico by making jobs available in factories located there.</u>

Negatives:

- Free trade has caused more U.S. job losses than gains, especially for higher-wage jobs.
- <u>People work for lower wages and there are fewer labor regulations in Mexico, so American</u> <u>factories have moved across the border.</u>
- Factories, called maquiladoras, are built on the Mexican border and workers are hired there to make goods at a much lower wage than workers would be paid in the U.S.
- <u>Mexico does not have as strict environmental regulations as Canada & U.S., so when</u> <u>factories move across the border, they are contributing to North America's pollution</u> <u>problem.</u>
- <u>Some argue that our borders should be open like the EU does in Europe, while others feel</u> <u>the borders should be closed.</u>
